2027 Time & Abilities--Additional Information

Theme: Be Thankful

Our Commitment: Each year during the annual Stewardship Campaign, we each consider how we will give to our congregation in the upcoming calendar year. The Time & Abilities is part of this commitment.

Background: Volunteer needs fall under LCI's four Pillars of Ministry plus the Council's administrative committees. Each pillar has a Lay Member Chair with a Council liaison. Pastor Dan, Lindsey Burns (Lay Youth & Family Minister) and LuAnn Higgs (Church Musician) actively advise these pillars. The Pillar Chair leads the Ministry planning and determines the frequency of committee meeting. For activities selected, the Chair will contact you or you may contact them directly.

This year we are adding this supplement to provide explanation to some of the activities to volunteer to give you a better picture of the ministry focus. We anticipate this supplement expanding as we learn how it helps to assist you.

Call to Action: As you mark your 2027 volunteer areas, consider both what excites you and what challenges you. We have vital services in LCI that are critical to the success of our Sunday services. These are scattered within the Pillars (not isolated in any one or two pillars). If you want to know more about what are these activities, reach out to the Ministry Chair, Lindsey Burns or one of our Stewardship Committee members (Marcia Holmes, Joan Marquand-Willse, & Carol Huegli).

Ministry Area explanations: additional information for ministry activities to assist you in selecting where you would like to participate. This is a growing area of additional information and will expand if you find it is helpful.

Worship & Music:

The members of the Worship & Music Committee work to have every worship service be a fulfilling experience. We prepare the worship space with appropriate liturgical decor including banners, altar care, and communion before the service begins. The greeters/ushers welcome all who come through the door. Within this Committee we have members of the congregation who write prayers, select hymns and count the offering. We also have the assisting ministers, the prayer ministers and the technical support team for sound, slides and streaming. The music opportunities include the Mighty Forte choir, song leading/cantor, offertory vocal or instrumental music, the handbell choir and the brass choir. We are glad to work with people who would like to

try something new and will help you become comfortable with your new skill.

All areas of this ministry involve groups of people so that no one person is doing a task every Sunday. Our technical support and liturgical decor groups both need more volunteers.

Social Justice:

- Homeless and Low income support might include volunteering at the Respite Center, assisting or leading collections for items needed by low income groups at the DUMC heating and cooling centers; or, assisting in the cold winter shelter food program.
- Immigrant Support: delivering groceries to undocumented immigrants and assisting with resettlement
- God's Work, Our Hands: includes both assisting in leading community projects and/or helping on the day of the project(s). Indicate preference if you have one.

Congregational Life:

- Hospitality Service: Plan and host Shrove Tuesday; monthly & Easter potlucks, New Years Eve party & other social events; funeral receptions; and more.
